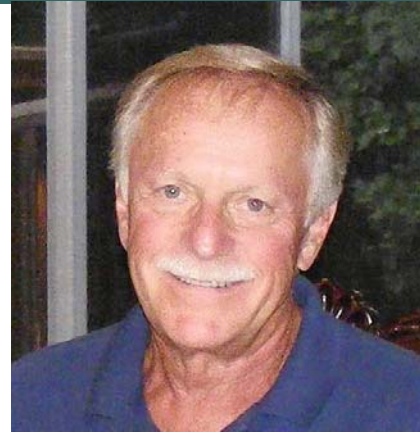
Patrick Deering helped make Leadership Baltimore County the program it is today. I will miss Patrick's mentorship, his guidance, but most importantly his friendship.
