Baltimore's New Homeless Shelter to Sleep 275

The Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Housing and Resource Center officially opened its doors on June 23, 2011, taking a major step in ending homelessness. The 3-story brick building will offer shelter, meals and services around the clock. In addition, the shelter offers access to vital services such as medical attention and job training.



The first floor offers separate day rooms for men and women, each outfitted with televisions, phones and game tables. The 2nd floor houses the men's dormitory while the 3rd houses the women's, with the addition of offices of Healthcare for the Homeless. There is a full service cafeteria which will serve breakfast and dinner, and a commercial-size laundry area for linens and things. The architectural design allows for natural, maximum light, not an institutional feel of other shelters.

"This facility is a permanent location where men and women will be provided with not only beds, meals and showers, but also-and more importantly-the services they need to move out of homelessness," stated Amy Kleine, director of the Basic Human Needs & Health Program at the Weinberg Foundation.

Leadership alums Mark Furst, CEO of United Way, and Nick D'Alesandro of the Baltimore County Department of Social Services, were on hand for the grand opening of the facility in June.

WHAT IS SERVANT LEADERSHIP?

The phrase “servant leadership” was first coined by Robert Greenleaf, who founded The Center for Applied Ethics in 1964. An essay in 1970 entitled, “The Servant as Leader” launched Greenleaf, the Servant Leadership movement. For more information on Greenleaf, please visit www.greenleaf.org.

"The servant-leader *is* servant first... It begins with the natural feeling that one wants to serve, to serve *first*. Then conscious choice brings one to aspire to lead. That person is sharply different from one who is *leader* first, perhaps because of the need to assuage an unusual power drive or to acquire material possessions... The leader-first and the servant-first are two extreme types. Between them there are shadings and blends that are part of the infinite variety of human nature."

"The difference manifests itself in the care taken by the servant-first to make sure that other people's highest priority needs are being served. The best test: Do those served grow as persons? Do they, while being served, become healthier, wiser, more autonomous and more likely themselves to become servants? And what is the effect on the least privileged in society? Will they benefit or at least not be further deprived?"
